God's love

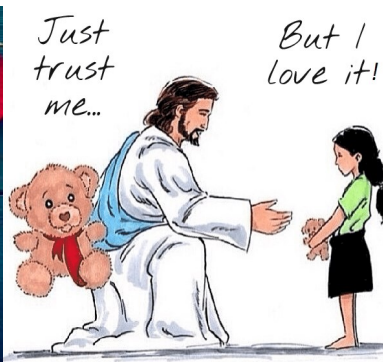

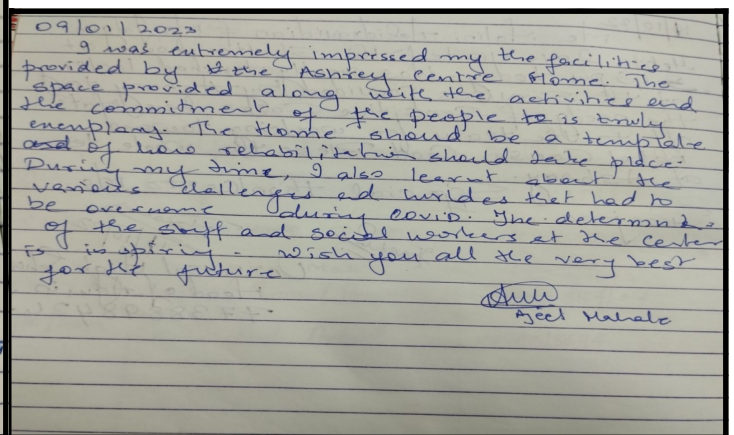
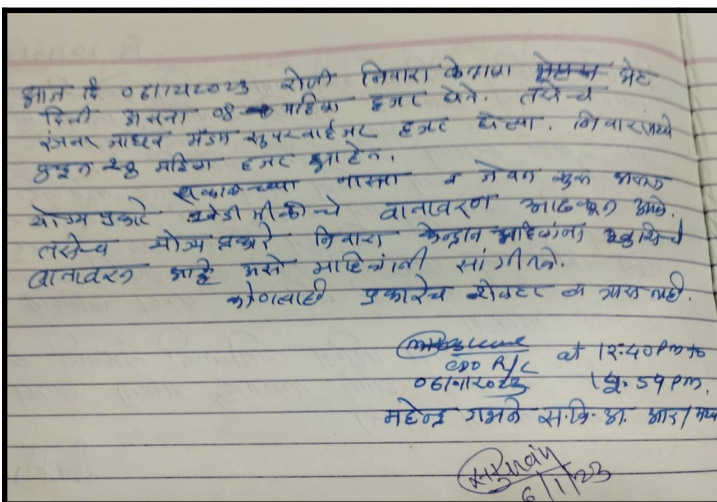
4. Beauty parlour exam was held on 22nd and 23rd December 2022. 28 students were present.

Tickle your Tastebuds

Chicken Caffreal - Angela Fernandes

Ingredients:-

- 1 kg chicken
- A small bunch of fresh coriander n mint leaves.
- 6--10sprigs of green pepper corns.
- 8--10 cardamons
- 10--15 cloves
- 4 sticks of cinnamon (5" long)
- 2" raw saffron turmeric and the 2" white turmeric.
- 5 tablespoons of red wine vinegar.

Procedure:

Wash the chicken, grind the ingredients and marinate for 1/2 an hour, the chicken with the masala and vinegar and salt. Keep aside. In a wide-open saucepan, heat oil and place the marinated chicken and cook on low fire till cooked and dry. If you want it more spicy add more green pepper corns. Garnish with curry leaves, or parsley or celery.
